A Dó is the duo of Katie Baughman and John Maschinot. John and Katie founded A Dó in 2010 but they've been performing together since 1994.

A Dó (ah doe – Irish for two) takes you on a music and dance journey complete with a variety of authentic instruments: the sweet, powerfully haunting sound of the uilleann, or Irish bagpipes; the lilting fiddle; the Irish wooden flute; the fascinating bodhran (Celtic drum); penny whistle; harmonium (reed organ) and of course, the percussive rhythm of hard-shoe step dancing!

Multi-talented Katie Baughman is an accomplished vocalist, fiddler and champion step-dancer. She sings beautiful ballads, lighthearted love songs and the occasional song in Irish and Scottish Gaelic.

John Maschinot is an accomplished multi-instrumentalist on the uilleann pipes (the uilleann pipes were developed for playing indoors. The instrument is not nearly as loud as its Scottish cousin!); Irish wooden flute, penny whistle, bodhran (drum) & harmonium, and has been known to tell a joke or two!

Some of the many venues that Katie and John have appeared include Spivey Hall, Georgia State University, the University of Georgia, Eddies Attic (Decatur, GA), Atlanta Celtic Christmas at Emory University, Atlanta Botanical Gardens and countless festivals and elementary and middle schools throughout Georgia.
